SCHOOL YEAR AND SCHEDULE

The calendar year runs September through June. There are two semesters and four marking periods. All classes are a full year. Classes are 60 minutes except for a different class each day which meets for 90 minutes. The maximum number of classes a student can take during the regular daily schedule is six.

ADDITIONAL FEATURES OF THE CURRICULUM

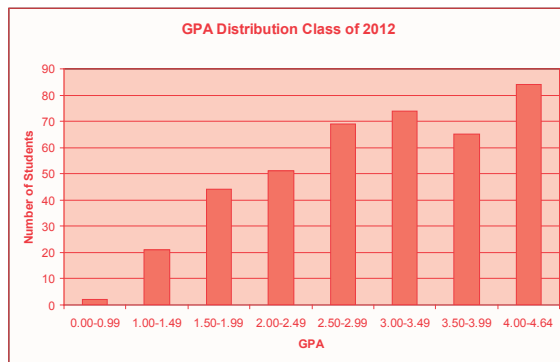
- **ALP Program:** provides alternative learning environment towards a BHS diploma, grades 9-12.
- **AP Courses:** English, History, Mathematics, Science, World Languages, Music – Total 17.
- **Career Academy:** internship course for seniors, 8 hours per week, in a placement related to a possible career choice.
- **Community Service:** elective course for seniors that offers training, supervision, volunteer placement and self-evaluation for students who are willing to perform service in a non-profit agency.
- **Dual Enrollment:** students take courses at the college level at the community college.
- **E Learning Program:** online courses for credit recovery.
- **ELL:** classes at the beginning, intermediate and advanced level for students who are learning the English language.
- **Project Excel:** for students in the last year of high school to earn graduation credit through alternative means.
- **Teaching Internship:** course for a student to work closely with a teacher in preparation of classroom materials, tutoring students, or teaching part of a class.
- **Virtual High School:** Rigorous online courses for students to earn credit at the AP, honors or college prep levels.

INTERPRETING THE ACADEMIC RECORD

Class Rank

The class rank is figured by multiplying the value of the earned grade in a course (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0) by the course level multiplier (AP=5, H=4, CP2=3, CP1=2, Basic (Special Education) =1) multiplied by the number of credits for the course, divided by the total sum of credits.

G.P.A. – Weighted G.P.A. is based on 4.0 MA State College/University admission standard.



CURRICULUM

Students choose from four levels:

Special Education (Basic) - Modified Classes

College Prep 1 (CP1) - Emphasizes basic skills

College Prep (CP2) - For college-bound students.

Honors (H) - For highly motivated college bound students requiring ability to move at a brisk pace.

Advanced Placement (AP) - For exceptional students who can achieve college level work in high school.
